I. **PURPOSE:**

To ensure the proper hygiene of the inmate population in the Rhode Island Department of Corrections (RIDOC).

II. POLICY:

RIDOC provides for the proper hygiene of all inmates within its custody to include the prevention and control of infectious diseases and infestations within the correctional environment.

III. PROCEDURES:

- A. Custody staff has the primary responsibility to monitor an inmate's hygiene and to notify the Health Care Services staff of any serious problems.
 - 1. When an officer determines an inmate's personal hygiene is lacking, s/he shall attempt to persuade the inmate to shower.
 - 2. If attempts to persuade the inmate to shower fail, the officer notifies the Shift Commander/designee who then notifies Health Care Services staff of the situation.
 - 3. Health Care Services staff and/or Behavioral Health Services staff provides patient education or behavioral health counseling as is deemed appropriate.
 - 4. If an inmate's lack of personal hygiene threatens their own health, the well-being of other inmates and the good order of the facility, the Warden/designee issues a direct order to the inmate with disciplinary action to follow if the inmate fails to comply with this order. If the inmate continues to be non-compliant, facility specific operating procedures (SOP) will be enforced.

<u>NOTE</u>: Within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this policy, all facility Wardens will present a SOP to the Assistant Director of Institutions and Operations for approval.

- B. Living areas must always be kept clean, to include daily sanitizing, sweeping and mopping of all publicly trafficked areas.
- C. Inmates shall be showered upon commitment to the appropriate intake facility. An initial shower is **mandatory** for **all new** commitments prior to being moved into a living area. This procedure does not apply to inmate transfers between facilities
- D. All inmates will have access to a shower with hot and cold running water.
- E. A shower will be permitted five (5) times per week, as facility schedule allows, but is required three (3) times per week for all inmates.
- F. Toilet paper will be supplied to inmates.

- G. Inmates are required to purchase personal hygiene items unless they are indigent. (See the most recent version of policy 2.25 DOC, <u>Indigent Inmates</u>, for the definition of indigent.) Inmates who are initially committed or indigent (unable to afford personal hygiene items) will be provided the following personal hygiene items:
 - 1. Shampoo
 - 2. Soap
 - 3. Comb
 - 4. Toothbrush
 - 5. Toothpaste
 - 6. Deodorant
 - 7. Sanitary napkins and tampons are provided for all female inmates (Women's Facilities)
 - 8. Shaving implements subject to security and mental health considerations
- H. Laundry services for inmates' clothing and linens are provided at least weekly. Initial commitments shall be given the building approved towels, face cloths and bed linens.
- I. Barbering/haircuts and hair care services are provided at a minimum of once every thirty (30) days.
