

Most Common Commitment **Charges**

- Violating a no-contact order
- Domestic assault
- Possession of a controlled substance
- Fugitive from justice
- Disorderly conduct
- · Failure to register as a sex offender

of individuals held at RIDOC on June 30, 2024 reported they were currently serving, discharged, retired or veterans of one of the American Armed Forces branches. 37 individuals were awaiting trial (29 at ISC, 1 at WF1, and 7 on home confinement) and 93 were sentenced (3 at ISC, 9 at MIN, 53 at MED, 20 at MAX, 1 at HSC, 2 at WF1, 2 on home confinement, and 3 serving out of state).

While most of those housed at RIDOC were 60+, the average age was 52.

Sentence Length

- Ranged from 20 days to 65 years.
- 15 are serving life with the possibility of parole
- 6 are serving life without the possibility of parole

Awaiting Trial:

43% Violent 11% Drug

38% Sex

8% Non-violent

Charge Description

The most common charges for those sentenced were 1st degree child molestation, murder, 1st degree sexual assault.
